Students in the STD degree program are required to participate in a research-related practice as part of their Curricular Practical Training (CPT). Since the STD often leads to a ministry as an academic or professional theologian, students' research-related practice can include writing projects (i.e. book reviews, dissertation proposals, syllabi, or lecture outlines etc.), teaching assistantships, course development, and/or retreat or workshop development.

International students in F-1 status are allowed to be employed in the U.S. under Curricular Practical Training (CPT) as long as the employment is an integral part of the degree curriculum.

This Memorandum of Understanding provides training objectives agreed upon by the faculty advisor, student, and off-site ministry contact person where applicable, and facilitates the authorization of CPT for the semester requested where applicable. Responsibilities include:

Student – Adheres to agreed upon ministry responsibilities and fully participates in the learning objectives.

Instructors – Provides class setting for the research practicum, per the syllabus.

Ministerial Contact Person – If a student is engaged in off-campus ministry, this person serves as an on-site contact person and verifies ministry for the appointed person of time.
