HOW DO I USE THIS IN MY CLASSROOM?

UDL can be used everywhere, and is already in more places than you might realize. For example, curb cuts in sidewalks allow people with wheelchairs, strollers, or limited mobility to access public walking space.







Closed-captioning in streaming media allows people with hearing difficulties, more limited English, or preferences for the written word to receive information. UDL allows the widest range of people to access something.

If the goal is for all learners to master content, then having a plan from the beginning for all learners to access it is key to success.
