

MA IN TEACHING & TEACHING CREDENTIAL (MATTC) TEACHER RESIDENCY

Program Overview

In collaboration with the Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE), Santa Clara University teacher candidates pursuing a single subject mathematics or science credential may be eligible for the SCCOE Teacher Residency Program. During their student teaching year, SCU Master of Arts in Teaching with Teaching Credential (MATTC) candidates in the Teacher Residency Program receive a \$25,000 stipend and additional professional support. Candidates in the Teacher Residency Program agree to teach in California public schools with a commitment to prioritize schools in Santa Clara County for a minimum of four years upon obtaining their preliminary teaching credential.

Application Process

- 1. Apply first to MATTC and indicate interest in the Teacher Residency Program under the Scholarships section of the application.
- 2. Once accepted to MATTC:
- Complete brief SCCOE residency application
- Meet with Placement Coordinator

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can I apply directly to the SCCOE Residency Program?

A: No. As a joint collaboration with the SCCOE, interested applicants must first apply to SCU's MATTC program. Once admitted to MATTC, candidates can then complete the brief application with SCCOE.

Q: Are international students eligible?

A: In order to be eligible, these students must be authorized to work in the United States in order to fulfill the four year teaching service obligation.

Q: How will I receive my stipend?

A: The SCCOE will disperse stipends directly to Teacher Residency Program candidates during their student teaching year.

Q: Are two year MATTC candidates eligible?

A: Yes, but they would not receive the stipend or the additional support until their student teaching year, which typically occurs in their second year of the program.
