

5. Update from Caltrain

Their current promotion is for us to purchase passes for an entire subset of users such as all undergraduate and graduate students or all faculty and staff in order to qualify for a subsidized rate. This is not economically feasible for our department, so we provided feedback. An example of a program that might work at SCU would be to purchase a specific number of passes at a subsidized rate and resell them out of our office to faculty, staff and students that were interested. Caltrain is looking into this option for SCU and, hopefully, will provide us with an update shortly.

- 6. Meeting update on potential sliding scale model
 - a. P&TS to provide HR with a list of employee names who purchased parking permits for 2023-2024. The listing should include a permit letter decal (B or BA) along with the employee's name.
- b. P &T Advisory Committee to create tiers for new sliding scale model
 There was a thorough update on this topic on the 2/16/24 meeting notes. HR would like to be
 involved in this project in an advisory capacity. They would provide data points so we could

create a tiered model based on annual income regardless of the constituents' role on campus. P&TS will provide a listing of permits purchased for Fall and Winter to HR who then can provide the data points, anonymously. A member suggested range units of 20-25K with 3-4 tiers at most with up to 10 so we can adjust as needed. The committee will aim to work on the tiered model in the Spring 2024 quarter.
